

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GENERAL INFORMATION

INTRODUCTION

Please read and understand all instructions in this manual carefully and thoroughly before attempting to operate this device. These instructions contain important safety and use information.

UNPACKING

This device has been thoroughly tested and has been shipped in perfect operating condition. Carefully check the shipping carton for damage that may have occurred during shipping. If the carton appears to be damaged, carefully inspect the device for damage and be sure that all accessories necessary to operate the device have arrived intact. In the event that damage has been found or parts are missing, please contact our customer support team for further instructions. Please do not return this device to your dealer without first contacting customer support at the number listed below. Please do not discard the shipping carton in the trash. Please recycle whenever possible.



ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS

A qualified electrician should be used for all electrical connections and/or installations.



FLAMMABLE MATERIAL WARNING

Keep fixture at least 7.9in. (0.2m) away from any flammable materials, decorations, pyrotechnics, etc.



MINIMUM DISTANCE TO OBJECTS/SURFACES IS 40 FEET (12 METERS)



AMBIENT OPERATING TEMPERATURE RANGE IS -4°F TO 104°F. (-20°C TO 40°C)

DO NOT INSTALL THE FIXTURE IF YOU ARE NOT QUALIFIED TO DO SO!

Fixture MUST be installed following all local, national, and country commercial electrical and construction codes and regulations. Before rigging/mounting the fixture to any metal truss/structure or placing the fixture on any surface, a professional equipment installer MUST be consulted to determine if the metal truss/structure or surface is properly certified to safely hold the combined weight of the fixture, clamps, cables, and accessories.

Overhead fixture installation must always be secured with a secondary safety attachment, such as an appropriately rated safety cable that meets all local, national, and country codes and regulations.

Fixture ambient operating temperature range is -4°F to 104°F. (-20°C to 40°C) Do not use this fixture when ambient temperature falls outside this temperature range.


Fixture should be installed away from walking paths, seating areas, or areas were unauthorized personnel might reach the fixture by hand.


NEVER stand directly below the fixture when rigging, removing, or servicing.

Allow approximately 15-minutes for the fixture to cool down before servicing.

The mounting bracket can be installed at two different locations on the fixture, as shown below: the top of the fixture, or the rear panel. Refer to the illustrations below.

TOP MOUNT






REAR MOUNT

INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

CLAMP INSTALLATION

This fixture features a mounting clamp attachment point, which is located on the mounting yoke, as well as a safety cable rigging point, located on the rear face of the unit near the display screen (see the illustration below). When mounting the fixture to a truss or any other suspended or overhead installation, be sure to secure an appropriately rated clamp (not included) to the mounting yoke by inserting a bolt of the appropriate size and weight rating through the clamp hole and the mounting yoke, then secure in place using a matching washer and nut. Always attach a separate SAFETY CABLE of the appropriate safety rating to the safety cable rigging point.





ALWAYS ATTACH A SAFETY CABLE WHENEVER INSTALLING THIS FIXTURE IN A SUSPENDED ENVIRONMENT TO ENSURE THE FIXTURE WILL NOT FALL IF THE CLAMP FAILS.

RIGGING

Overhead rigging requires extensive experience, including but not limited to: calculating working load limits, understanding the installation material being used, and periodic safety inspection of all installation material and the fixture itself. If you lack these qualifications, do not attempt to perform the installation yourself. Improper installation can result in bodily injury.


CONTROL PANEL

The device includes an easy to navigate system menu that can be accessed via a set of control buttons located on the back of the device below the digital display.

MODE: Press to cycle through main menu options (Auto, Sound, Sec, DMX).

ENTER: Press to confirm selection and open up the option sub-menu, if applicable.

UP/DOWN: Press to scroll through menu or sub-menu options.

REMOTE OPERATION

The unit can only be controlled when it has been set to Primary mode. The unit will NOT respond to commands when operating in Secondary mode.

- On: Fixture turns on and reverts to the last running state
- Off: Fixture goes into stand by mode in a blackout state.
- **Color:** Activates color mode. Select a static color using the colored keys. The intensity for the set color can then be adjusted with the + / buttons. Selectable colors are red, green, blue, orange, lime green, pink, amber, cyan, magenta, yellow, purple, and white.
- Auto: Activate auto program mode. Press this button, then use the + and buttons to cycle through the programs until you find your desired program. Then press the Speed button, and use the + and buttons to adjust the program speed.
- **Sound:** Runs through the sound active mode, in which the unit responds to microphone inputs. Press this button, then use the + and buttons to cycle through the programs until you find your desired program.
- Flash: This button has no defined function for this unit.
- **Speed:** Sets program speed. Press this button, then use the + and buttons to adjust program speed. Please note that this button is used in multiple operating modes.
- **+ and buttons:** These two buttons cycle through available built-in programs, adjust color intensity, or adjust program speed, depending on currently selected operating mode.

PRIMARY-SECONDARY SET UP

This function allows you to link units together to run in a Primary-Secondary set-up, in which one unit will act as the controlling unit and the others will react to the controlling unit's built-in programs. Any unit can be configured to act as a Primary or as a Secondary, but only one unit in a given system can be programmed to act as the Primary.

Primary-Secondary Connections and Settings:

- 1. Daisy chain your units via the XLR connectors on the rear panels of each unit. Use standard XLR data cables to link your units together. Remember that the male XLR connector is the input and the female XLR connector is the ouput. The first unit in the chain (primary) will use the female XLR connector only. The last unit in the chain will use the male XLR connector only.
- 2. On the Primary unit, use the control panel and display screen to set the unit to the desired operating mode, just as you would if the unit were operating as a stand-alone device.
- 3. On each Secondary unit, use the control panel and display screen to navigate to the "Addr" option in the main menu. Simply leave the unit set to "Addr" to set the device as a Secondary unit.
- 4. The secondary units will now follow the behavior of the primary unit.

MULTI UNIT POWER LINKING

This features allows you to connect the fixtures to one another using the power cable input and output sockets.

The maximum number of units that can be linked in this manner is 6 units. *DO NOT EXCEED THIS MAXIMUM NUMBER WHEN POWER LINKING UNITS!*

All linked units must be of the same make and model type. Do not mix and match units!

DMX SETUP


DMX-512: DMX is short for Digital Multiplex. This is a universal protocol used as a form of communication between intelligent fixtures and controllers. A DMX controller sends DMX data instructions from the controller to the fixture. DMX data is sent as serial data that travels from fixture to fixture via the DATA "IN" and DATA "OUT" XLR terminals located on all DMX fixtures (most controllers only have a DATA "OUT" terminal).

DMX Linking: DMX is a language allowing all makes and models of different manufacturers to be linked together and operate from a single controller, as long as all fixtures and the controller are DMX compliant. To ensure proper DMX data transmission, try to use the shortest cable path possible when linking several DMX fixtures. The order in which fixtures are connected in a DMX line does not influence the DMX addressing. For example, a fixture assigned a DMX address of 1 may be placed anywhere in a DMX line: at the beginning, at the end, or anywhere in the middle. When a fixture is assigned a DMX address of 1, the DMX controller knows to send DATA assigned to address 1 to that unit, no matter where it is located in the DMX chain.

Data Cable (DMX Cable) Requirements (For DMX Operation): This unit can be controlled via DMX-512 protocol. Your unit and your DMX controller require a 3-pin XLR connector for data input/output. We recommend Accu-Cable DMX cables. If you are making your own cables, be sure to use standard 110-120 Ohm shielded cable (This cable may be purchased at almost all pro lighting stores). Your cables should be made with a male and female XLR connector on either end of the cable. Also remember that DMX cable must be daisy chained and cannot be split.




Notice: Be sure to follow the figures below when making your own cables. Do not use the ground lug on the XLR connector. Do not connect the cable's shield conductor to the ground lug or allow the shield conductor to come in contact with the XLR's outer casing. Grounding the shield could cause a short circuit and erratic behavior.



DMX SETUP

Special Note: Line Termination. When longer runs of cable are used, you may need to use a terminator on the last unit to avoid erratic behavior. A terminator is a 110-120 ohm 1/4 watt resistor which is connected between pins 2 and 3 of a male XLR connector (DATA + and DATA -). This unit is inserted in the female XLR connector of the last unit in your daisy chain to terminate the line. Using a cable terminator (ADJ part number Z-DMX/T) will decrease the possibilities of erratic behavior.




Not Used

A DMX512 terminator reduces signal errors, avoiding most signal reflection interference. Connect PIN 2 (DMX-) and PIN 3 (DMX+) of the last fixture in series with a 120 Ohm, 1/4 W Resistor to terminate the DMX512.

Do Not Use

5-Pin XLR DMX Connectors: Some manufacturers use 5-pin DMX-512 data cables for DATA transmission in place of 3-pin. 5-pin DMX fixtures may be integrated into a 3-pin DMX line with a 5-pin to 3-pin adapter cable. These adapters are available at most electric stores, or they may be assembled using the conversion chart below.



DMX SETUP

DMX ADDRESSING

All fixtures should be given a DMX starting address when operating with a DMX controller, in order to ensure that the correct fixture responds to the correct control signal. This digital starting address is the channel number from which the fixture starts to "listen" to the digital control signal sent out from the DMX controller. This starting DMX address is assigned by setting the correct DMX address on the digital control display on the fixture.

You can set the same starting address for all fixtures or a group of fixtures, or set different addresses for each individual fixture. Setting all fixtures to the same DMX address will cause all fixtures to react in the same way. In this case, please note that changing the settings of one channel will affect all the fixtures simultaneously.

If you set each fixture to a different DMX address, each unit will start to "listen" to the channel numBer you have set, based on the quantity of DMX channels of each fixture. That means changing the settings of one channel will only affect the selected fixture.

As an example, when operating this device in 3-channel mode, you should set the starting DMX address of the first unit to 1, the second unit to 4 (1 + 3), the third unit to 7 (1 + 3 + 3), and so on.



CLEANING

Frequent cleaning is recommended to ensure proper function, optimized light output, and an extended life. The frequency of cleaning depends on the environment in which the device operates: damp, smoky, or particularly dirty environments can cause greater accumulation of dirt on the fixture housing and/or light fixture optics. Clean the external surface and the front lens of the device periodically with a soft cloth to avoid dirt/debris accumulation.

NEVER use alcohol, solvents, or ammonia-based cleaners.

MAINTENANCE

Regular inspections are recommended to ensure proper function and extended life. There are no user serviceable parts inside these devices; please refer all other service issues to Eliminator Lighting. Should you need any spare parts, please order genuine parts from Eliminator Lighting.

Please refer to the following points during routine inspections:

- A detailed review should be performed by an approved electrical engineer every three months, to make sure the circuit contacts are in good condition in order to prevent overheating.
- Be sure all screws and fasteners are securely tightened at all times. Loose screws may fall out during normal operation, resulting in damage or injury as larger parts could fall.
- Check for any deformations on the unit. Deformations could allow for dust to enter into the device, or cause the device to fall and seriously injure a person(s).
- Electric power supply cables must not show any damage, material fatigue, or sediments.

FUSE REPLACEMENT

This device features a replaceable fuse located alongside the Power Input on the back side of the device. To access the fuse, use a flat head screwdriver to catch the groove in the wall of the Power Input. **BE CAREFUL NOT TO DAMAGE THE FUSE CLIP, THE POWER INPUT, OR THE PRONGS.** When replacing the fuse, be sure to replace the correct one, as the fuse clip contains both an operational fuse and a spare fuse. **Replace the fuse only with an identical F5A 250V fuse.**




