This fixture can be used in a stand alone mode or connected in a Primary/Secondary configuration. This wash has seven operating modes: 6Color Change mode, 30 Color Change mode, Auto Fade mode, Auto Run Mode, Manual Mode, Static Color Mode, and DMX Control Mode.

An IP65 rated lighting fixture is one, which has been designed and tested to protect against the ingress of dust (6) and low-pressure water jets from any direction (5).

### PROTECTIVE VENT



This IP rated fixture features a protective vent valve that equalizes the pressure, prevents contamination, and reduces condensation, ultimately extending the lifetime of the fixture.



# IMPORTANT MUST READ

If this fixture is installed in an extreme and/or harsh outdoor/wet environment, it MUST be powered ON and used for a minimum of 30 minutes every 10-15 days. Prolonged exposure to an extreme and/or harsh outdoor/wet environment without usage as stated above can lead to component damage and/or shortening the lifetime of the fixture. Any component damage found to be as a direct result of not following this guideline may void the limited warranty.

### **SET UP**

**Power Supply:** The ADJ 7PZ IP contains an automatic voltage switch, which will auto sense the voltage when it is plugged into the power source. With this switch there is no need to worry about the correct power voltage, this unit can be plugged in anywhere.

**DMX-512:** DMX is short for Digital Multiplex. This is a universal protocol used as a form of communication between intelligent fixtures and controllers. A DMX controller sends DMX data instructions from the controller to the fixture. DMX data is sent as serial data that travels from fixture to fixture via the DATA "IN" and DATA "OUT" XLR terminals located on all DMX fixtures (most controllers only have a DATA "OUT" terminal).

**DMX Linking:** DMX is a language allowing all makes and models of different manufactures to be linked together and operate from a single controller, as long as all fixtures and the controller are DMX compliant. To ensure proper DMX data transmission, when using several DMX fixtures try to use the shortest cable path possible. The order in which fixtures are connected in a DMX line does not influence the DMX addressing. For example; a fixture assigned a DMX address of 1 may be placed anywhere in a DMX line, at the beginning, at the end, or anywhere in the middle. When a fixture is assigned a DMX address of 1, the DMX controller knows to send DATA assigned to address 1 to that unit, no matter where it is located in the DMX chain.

Data Cable (DMX Cable Requirements (For DMX Operation: The 7PZ IP can be controlled via DMX-512 protocol. Your unit and your DMX controller requires either a 3-pin or 5-pin XLR connector for data input and data output. We recommend Accu-Cable DMX cables. If you are making your own cables, be sure to use standard 110-120 Ohm shielded cable (This cable may be purchased at almost all pro lighting stores). Your cables should be made with a male and female XLR connector on either end of the cable. Also remember that DMX cable must be daisy chained and cannot be split.

TO MAINTAIN IP65 RATING INTEGRITY AND PREVENT WATER FROM ENTERING THE FIXTURE, ALL UNUSED CONNECTION RUBBER CAPS MUST BE SEALED AND ONLY IP65 RATED POWER AND DATE CABLES MUST BE USED.

### **SET UP**

**Special Note: Line Termination.** When longer runs of cable are used, you may need to use a terminator on the last unit to avoid erratic behavior. A terminator is a 110-120 ohm 1/4 watt resistor which is connected between pins 2 and 3 of a male XLR connector (DATA + and DATA -). This unit is inserted in the female XLR connector of the last unit in your daisy chain to terminate the line. Using a cable terminator (ADJ part number Z-DMX/T) will decrease the possibilities of erratic behavior.



Termination reduces signal errors and avoids signal transmission problems and interference. It is always advisable to connect a DMX terminal, (Resistance 120 Ohm 1/4 W) between PIN 2 (DMX-) and PIN 3 (DMX +) of the last fixture.

**5-Pin XLR DMX Connectors.** Some manufactures use 5-pin DMX- 512 data cables for DATA transmission in place of 3-pin. 5-pin DMX fixtures may be implemented in a 3-pin DMX line. When inserting standard 5-pin data cables in to a 3-pin line a cable adaptor must be used, these adaptors are readily available at most electric stores. The chart below details a proper cable conversion.

#### LED Display On/Off:

To set the LED display to turn off after 60 seconds, press the MODE button until "**don**" is displayed, press the UP button to display "**doff**". Now the display will disappear after 60s. Press any button to turn the display on again. Be advised though that the display will turn off automatically after 10 seconds.

To set the display press the MODE button until "dXX" is displayed. Use the UP or DOWN buttons to select either: "don" = LED display on at all times.

"doFF" = LED display shuts off after 60 seconds.

#### **LED Display Inversion:**

Follow these instructions to flip the display 180° so that the display can be read upside down.

- 1. Plug the fixture in and press the MODE button until "dXX" is dis-played. "XX" represents either "on" or "oFF".
- 2. Press the SET UP button until "**Stnd**" or "**rev**" is displayed. 3. Press the UP or DOWN buttons to reverse the display 180°.

#### **DMX Mode:**

Operating through a DMX controller gives the user the freedom to create their own programs tailored to their needs. This function also allows the fixtures to be used as spotlights. The 7PZ IP has 12 DMX modes.

- 1. This function will allow you to control each individual fixture's traits with a standard DMX 512 controller.
- To run your fixture in DMX mode, enter the MENU screen by pressing and holding the MODE button. Press
  the UP or DOWN buttons until "Menu Set ADDR" is displayed. Press the ENTER button then use the UP
  or DOWN buttons to select your desired DMX address. Press ENTER after you have found your desired
  address.
- 3. After you have set your desired DMX address, select your desired DMX channel mode. Access the main menu and press the UP or DOWN buttons until "**Menu UserMode**" is displayed.
- 4. Use the UP or DOWN buttons to scroll through the DMX Channel modes. When you have found your desired DMX Channel mode press ENTER.
- 5. Please see pages 9-21 for DMX values and traits.
- 6. After you have chosen your desired DMX Channel mode plug in the fixture via the XLR connections to any standard DMX controller.

#### **Dimmer Curve Setting:**

- 1. Plug the fixture in and access the main menu. Press the UP or DOWN buttons until "**Menu Function**" is displayed, and press ENTER.
- 2. Press the UP or DOWN buttons until "Dim Curve" is displayed, and press ENTER.

- 2. Press the UP or DOWN buttons until "Wireless CH:XX" is displayed. "XX" represents the current displayed address. Press ENTER to access, and use the UP or DOWN buttons to adjust the wireless channel.

#### LCD.Set:

This menu is used to adjust the backlight to stay on all the time or turn off after about 5 seconds, set the Key Lock, and Display Flash.

- 2. Press the UP or DOWN buttons until "Wireless" is displayed. Press ENTER to access, and use the UP or DOWN buttons to switch between "ON" (wireless activated) or "OFF" (wireless deactivated).
- 3. Press ENTER to confirm your selection and press the MODE button to exit this menu.

#### **Current Running Time:**

- Press the MODE button to access the main menu. Press the UP or DOWN buttons so that "Menu Info" is highlighted, then press ENTER.
- 2. Press the UP or DOWN buttons, until "Info TimeInfo" is displayed, and press ENTER.
- 3. Press the UP or DOWN buttons, until "TimeInfo Current" is displayed, and press ENTER.
- 4. The current running time will now be displayed, press MODE to exit.

#### NOTE: ONLY QUALIFIED TECHNICIANS SHOULD PERFORM THIS FUNCTION.

- Press the MODE button to access the main menu. Press the UP or DOWN buttons so that "Menu ZoomRset" is highlighted, then press ENTER.
- 2. Press the UP or DOWN buttons, until "ZoomRset Calibrat" is displayed, and press ENTER.
- 3. The display will now show the current calibration setting.

### **Secondary Setting:**

- Press the MODE button to access the main menu. Press the UP or DOWN buttons so that "Menu Secondry" is highlighted, then press ENTER.

#### PRIMARY-SECONDARY CONFIGURATION

This function will allows you to link units together to run in a Primary-Secondary mode. In Primary-Secondary operation one unit will act as the controlling unit and the others will react to the controlling units built-in programs. Any unit can act as a Primary or as a Secondary; however, only one unit can be programmed to act as the "Primary." Primary-Secondary Connections and Settings:

- Daisy chain your units via the XLR connector on the rear of the unit. Use standard XLR data cables to link your units together. Remember that the Male XLR connector is the input and the Female XLR connector is the output. The first unit in the chain (primary) will use the female XLR connector only. The last unit in the chain will use the male XLR connector only.
- 2. Connect the first "Secondary" unit to the "Primary", and the "Secondary" unit should now start to follow the "Primary".
- 3. Set the "**Primary**" unit to your desired mode of operation.
- 4. On the "Secondary" units press the MODE button until "**Menu Secondry**" is displayed and press ENTER. The unit is now set as the "Secondary" unit. Each secondary unit must be set to the same setting.

### **WIFLY SETUP**

With this feature you are able to control the unit with DMX without the need of XLR cables. Your DMX controller must be connected to a ADJ WiFly TransCeiver to use this function. You are able to communicate up to 2500 feet/760 meters (open line of sight).

- 1. Turn on the WiFly function using the instructions on page 17.
- 2. Follow the instructions on page 26 to set the Wireless address. The address must match the address set on the WiFly Transceiver.
- 3. After you have set the WiFly address, follow the DMX instructions on pages 15-16 to select your desired DMX Channel mode and set your DMX address.
- 4. Apply power to the ADJ WiFly Transceiver. The fixture must be set up first before you apply power to WiFly Transceiver.

Note: If the sync does not work, switch the WiFly power off then on again.

### WIFLY PRIMARY-SECONDARY SETUP

This feature will let you link units to run in a Primary-Secondary mode without the use of XLR cables.


- 1. Follow the instructions on page 26 to set the Wireless address. The addresses on each fixture must be the same.
- 2. After you have set the WiFly address, select your primary unit and set your desired operating mode.
- 3. Turn on the WiFly function using the instructions on page 18.
- 4. For the Secondary units, put the unit in **Secondry** mode. See Primary-Secondary configuration when setting the unit as a Secondary, then switch ON the WiFly power.

NOTE: If they do not sync up Primary-secondary, switch the Primary fixtures WiFly off then on again.







### **POWER CORD DAISY CHAIN**

With this feature, you can connect the fixtures to one another using a IP-rated connector cable (sold separately). The quantity that can be connected is 15 fixtures maximum. After 15 fixtures you will need to use a new power outlet. They must be the same fixtures. DO NOT mix fixtures.

### TROUBLE SHOOTING

Listed below are a few common problems the user may encounter, with solutions.

### **Unit not responding to DMX:**

1. Check that the DMX cables are connected properly and are wired correctly (pin 3 is "hot"; on some other DMX devices pin 2 may be 'hot'). Also, check that all cables are connected to the right connectors; it does matter which way the inputs and outputs are connected.

#### **CLEANING**

Due to fog residue, smoke, and dust cleaning the internal and external optical lenses must be carried out periodically to optimize light output.

- 1. Use normal glass cleaner and a soft cloth to wipe down the outside casing.
- 2. Clean the external optics with glass cleaner and a soft cloth every 20 days.
- 3. Always be sure to dry all parts completely before plugging the unit back in.

Cleaning frequency depends on the environment in which the fixture operates (i.e. smoke, fog residue, dust, dew).
